



THE SECOND READING - 1 Corinthians 15:1-11

1 Now I make known to you, brethren, the gospel which I preached to you, which also you received, in which also you stand, 2 by which also you are saved, if you hold fast the word which I preached to you, unless you believed in vain. 3 For I delivered to you as of first importance what I also received, that Christ died for our sins according to the Scriptures, 4 and that He was buried, and that He was raised on the third day according to the Scriptures, 5 and that He appeared to Cephas, then to the twelve. 6 After that He appeared to more than five hundred brethren at one time, most of whom remain until now, but some have fallen asleep; 7 then He appeared to James, then to all the apostles; 8 and last of all, as to one untimely born, He appeared to me also. 9 For I am the least of the apostles, and not fit to be called an apostle, because I persecuted the

church of God. 10 But by the grace of God I am what I am, and His grace toward me did not prove vain; but I labored even more than all of them, yet not I, but the grace of God with me. 11 Whether then it was I or they, so we preach and so you believed. (NASB)

THE GOSPEL LESSON - Mark 16:1-8

C: "Glory be to Thee, O Lord!" (Sung)

1 When the Sabbath was over, Mary Magdalene, and Mary the mother of James, and Salome, bought spices, so that they might come and anoint Him. 2 Very early on the first day of the week, they *came to the tomb when the sun had risen. 3 They were saying to one another, "Who will roll away the stone for us from the entrance of the tomb?" 4 Looking up, they *saw that the stone had been rolled away, although it was extremely large. 5 Entering the tomb, they saw a young man sitting at the right, wearing a white



robe; and they were amazed. 6 And he *said to them, "Do not be amazed; you are looking for Jesus the Nazarene, who has been crucified. He has risen; He is not here; behold, here is the place where they laid Him. 7 But go, tell His disciples and Peter, 'He is going ahead of you to Galilee; there you will see Him, just as He told you." 8 They went out and fled from the tomb, for trembling and astonishment had gripped them; and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid. (NASB)

THE NICENE CREED (Spoken Together)

The Practice of Closed Communion

The Lord's Supper is the holy of holies of the New Testament Church. Therefore, we follow the New Testament practice of closed communion. This practice of communing only those who have been instructed in the doctrine of Jesus and the Apostles is found and mandated from the opening days of the New Testament Church and is seen in the Book of Acts. Holy Communion testifies to our oneness in the teaching of the Apostles (Acts 2:42). The Bible and Lutheran Confessions teach that those who eat of Christ's body and drink of Christ's blood are to believe in the real presence of Christ in the sacrament, the efficacy of the forgiveness of sins given in the Lord's Supper, and be of a humble and contrite heart (1 Cor. 11:17-34). We invite communicant members of confessional Lutheran churches to commune with us. We ask others to speak with the pastor. If you are interested in communicant membership, speak with the Pastor.
